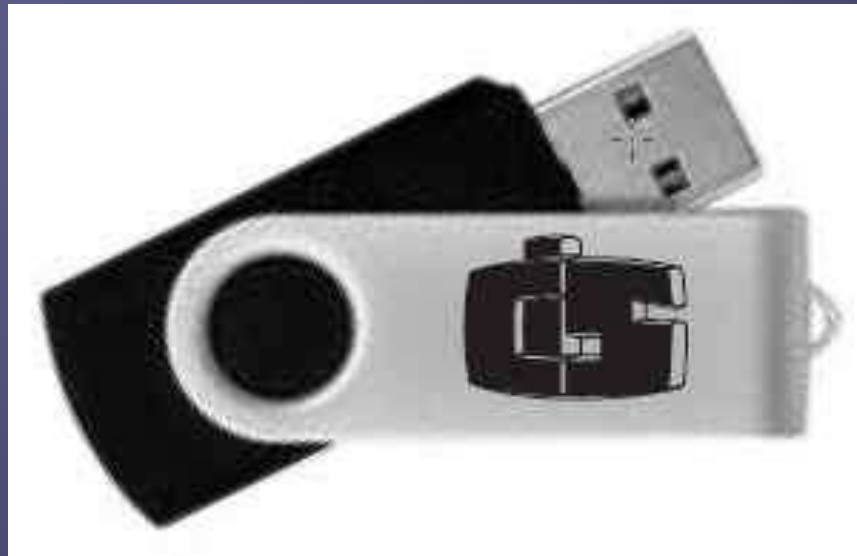

A global OSH information exchange system

- Latin American countries (ALASEHT, Instituto Laboral Andino)
- Asia (ASEAN-OSHnet)
- Francophone Africa (IAPRP or CRADAT)
- Europe (Bilbao Agency)
- Caribbean countries (Organization of American States, CARICOM)
- Nordic countries
- Slavonic countries

The way forward – A plan for 2010-2011

- Ensure that Centres have a functional, well-designed website
- Ensure that Centres are well trained (capacity building)
- Promote the sustainability of CIS Centres
- Ask every Centre to have a dedicated box
- Ensure the visibility of CIS (CIS logo on website)
- Involve the OSH specialists in the regions

The way forward – A plan for 2010-2011

- Develop the network of regional Centres
- Focus on regional meetings
- Involve CIS Centres in CIS core products: CISDOC database, Encyclopaedia, other practical tools (training, etc)
- Involve other institutions such as IALI, ICOH, ASSE, etc
- Increase the number of Labour Inspectorates and social security associations in the network

Development of the CIS Centres Network

- Strengthen the network in francophone Africa, Latin America and Asia
- Prepare a background document to strengthen the CIS Centres network
- Prepare a technical cooperation project to try and get some funding from donors
